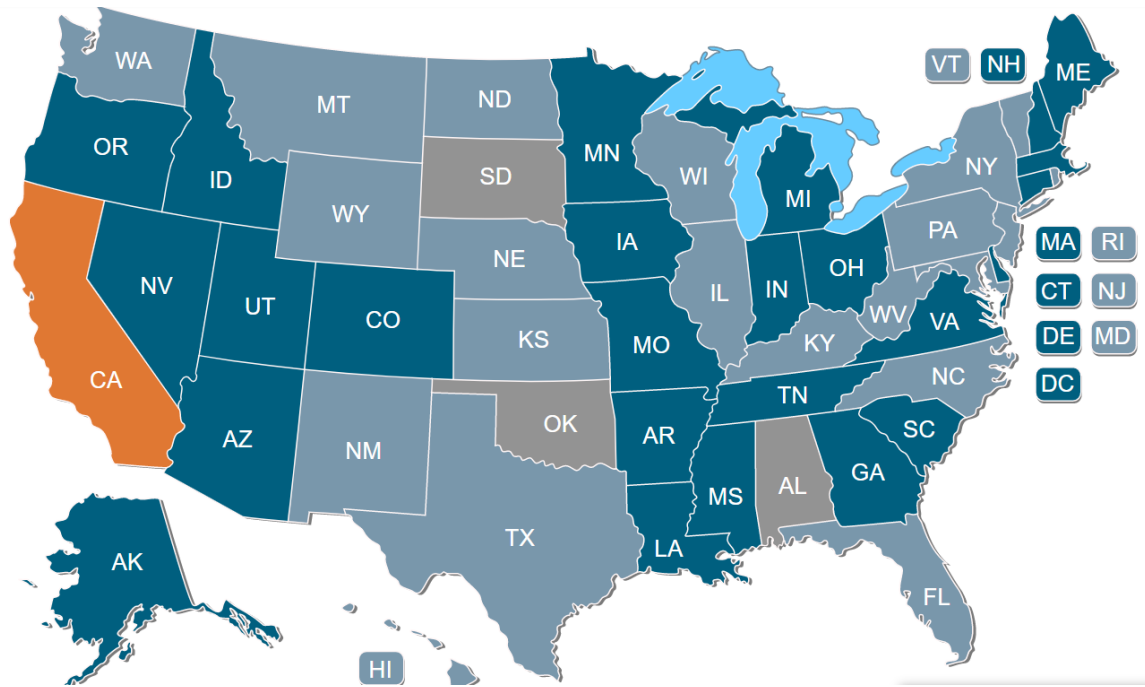


States for which THSU's Program Meets Licensure Requirements

THSU's MSAOM program prepares students for state licensure throughout the U.S., except in California (which has its own requirements), and Alabama, Oklahoma, and South Dakota (which do not have licensure practice laws). Some other states may require credits in subjects not covered under Texas practice law (such as Florida, which requires courses in injection therapy), courses in state scope of practice laws (jurisprudence), or other subjects. Prospective students are encouraged to research the requirements for licensure in the state(s) in which they plan to work.

State	Notes
Massachusetts	Chinese Herbology or Oriental Medicine certification is required to practice herbs.
New Jersey	Chinese Herbology or Oriental Medicine certification is required to practice herbs.
Ohio	Chinese Herbology or Oriental Medicine certification is required to practice herbs.
Pennsylvania	Acupuncture certification is not required; however, passage of the Chinese Herbology exam is required to practice herbs.
Vermont	Acupuncture certification is not required; however, passage of the Chinese Herbology exam is required to practice herbs.
Washington DC	Chinese Herbology or Oriental Medicine certification is required to practice herbs.
